attention Texas royalty owners

Section 91.504, Texas Natural Resources Code, gives an owner of a royalty interest in oil or gas produced in Texas the right to request from a payor information about itemized deductions, the heating value of the gas, and the Railroad Commission of Texas identification number for the lease, property, or well that may not have been provided to the royalty interest owner.

The request must be in writing and must be made by certified mail. A payor must respond to a request regarding itemized deductions, the heating value of the gas, or the Railroad Commission of Texas identification number by certified mail not later than the 60th day after the date the request is received. Additional information regarding production and related information may be obtained by contacting the Railroad Commission of Texas' Office of Public Assistance or accessing the commission's website.

attention Kansas royalty owners

Section 55-1622 of the Kansas Statutes gives an owner of a royalty interest in oil or gas produced in Kansas the right to specifically request any of the following information from a payor about the owner's royalty payment and the wells for which is made: each lease and name, property or well identification number used by the payor for royalty payment purposes, the field name, total produced volume for a given sales period, listing of the amount and purpose of deductions or adjustments from the royalty owner's share of the sale not identified on the payment statement, whether any payments reported are from a split-stream sale, whether the sale of any of the production for which payment is made by payor has been made to an affiliate of the payor.

The request by the royalty owner must be made in writing, specifying the information desired and the sales period or periods for which the information is needed. The payor must respond to such a request by certified mail not later than the 60th day after the date of the request is received. For more information on this law please refer to the Kansas Legislature's website.

aggregate pay

Many states have passed "aggregate" pay laws that allow producers to accumulate royalty obligations up to a specified amount before making payment to owners. In most states, aggregate payment amounts stand at \$100. Attention Alabama, Kansas and Oklahoma property owners: In addition to the above law, before proceeds greater than \$25 is accumulated, there is an option for the payee to be paid monthly for proceeds greater than \$25. Attention Louisiana property owners: Before proceeds may be accumulated, there is an option for the payee to be paid monthly when the accumulated proceeds exceeds \$10. owner confidentiality

ExxonMobil respects the privacy of our owners. Please remember that we are unable to release information to third parties on any account without prior written authorization from the owner unless legally required. In order for us to discuss your account with your appointed representative, we must be furnished with your written authorization.

disclosure of company information

Due to the proprietary nature of information, ExxonMobil may not always be able to respond to certain questions you may have regarding properties. Information not for general release includes:

- Forecasts of production
- Future development plans
- Reserve Estimates

address changes

It is very important that you keep us informed of an address change even if you

are receiving your funds electronically. Your correct address on file will allow you to receive future ExxonMobil mailings and 1099 tax information timely. You may use the provided Clip N' Mail form or send in your signed written request.

stale dated checks

Please note that all ExxonMobil payments are voided after 180 days of issuance. It is important that you cash your payments regardless of the amount prior to the 180 day mark. After 180 days, the check is considered "stale dated" in which ExxonMobil will no longer honor the check presented for payment.

stop payments

If you have not received your check and have waited 10 business days, our phone team will gladly process a stop payment for you and have your funds issued to you in the next available check process. Once we place a stop payment on your check, please do not attempt to cash the check. The check will be voided in our system and will no longer be honored by ExxonMobil.

direct deposit

If you want to receive your payments via direct deposit to your bank, view the information on page 2 and complete the application on page 3. Keep in mind, this is a free service and we can only deposit funds to your account. We cannot withdraw any funds under any circumstances.

minimum pay

Annually, ExxonMobil Private Royalty Department will issue funds to owners that have not reached the aggregate pay level of \$100. If you have less than \$100 in your account, that amount will be issued to you during our Minimum Pay process.

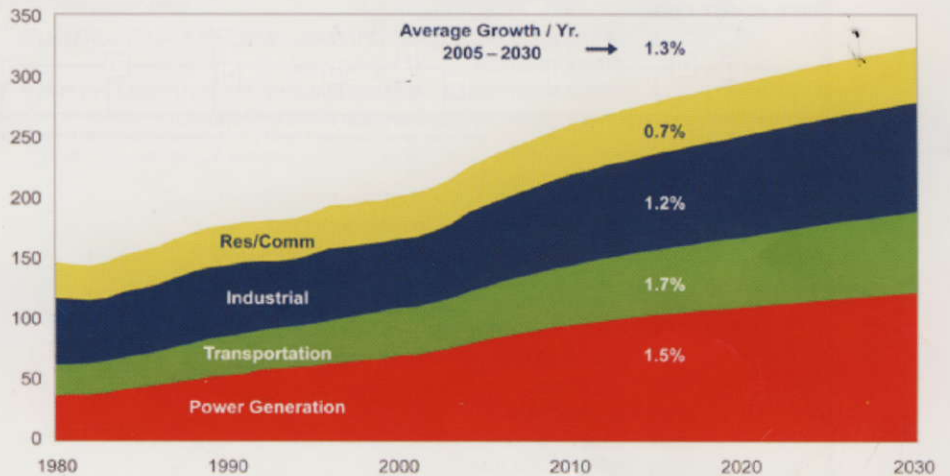
global energy demand

ExxonMobil projects that global energy demand will grow by 1.3% annually, on average, from 2005 to 2030 – resulting in about a 40% increase from 2005 to 2030.

- Energy demand is projected to grow fastest in the developing world (non-OECD countries) in the coming decade accounting for approximately 80% of the global increase
- Fossil fuels will continue to provide approximately 80% of global energy supplies in 2030, according to the U.S. Energy Information Administration and the International Energy Agency. Approximately 55–60% of supplies will be provided by oil and natural gas.

worldwide giving

Our worldwide spending includes contributions to nonprofit organizations as well as funds invested in social projects through various joint-venture arrangements, production-sharing agreements, projects operated by others, and contractual social bonus arrangements.
